A little history....

Scotts was first established in 1955 by Mr W. A. Scott, a Trinity College, Dublin graduate. Formerly an old fish shop, Howbury Street originally had just one consulting room and on a Tuesday afternoon this room became an operating theatre. The waiting room was the passage from the front door. The office had an open fire, around which some animals were laid to recover from their anaesthetic and there were 4 walk-in kennels in the 'outhouse'. The business dealt mostly with Large Animals in the early days. As the business expanded so did the numbers of vets and support staff and the requirement for development of the premises to accommodate more clinical facilities, consulting areas and a waiting 'room'. Mr Scott was very enthusiastic about exotic species and was a committee member of the British Veterinary Zoological Society, for which he carried out zoo inspections. It was his passion for avian and exotic species that led to the supply of veterinary services to Woburn Wild Animal Kingdom [as it was known then] now called Woburn Safari Park. What do I do in an emergency?

Always call our team on 01234 261622 in the first
instance, day or night, weekday or weekend.

Our own dedicated team of vets and nurses will triage
your call and provide emergency care during the daytime
Monday to Sunday and overnight Monday to Thursday.

On a Friday, Saturday and Sunday night (and Bank Holiday
nights) Vets Now provide our overnight emergency care.
If you call us after 7pm on a Friday and after 5.30pm on a
Saturday and Sunday, your call will auto-divert to Vets
Now, who are based in Barton-le-Clay.

Our team will handle your call at all other times.
Any pets in our hospital will always remain in our hospital,
where our team provide 24hour hospital care.
